He has a step up in trip to contend with here, but has shaped like a stayer and is backed to be just as effective over this longer trip. Alqamar was in behind on the second of those occasions and he must also be considered and still looks a horse full of potential. Zenon is a strong travelling type who could be helped by the application of blinkers and the added bonus of Ryan Moore in the saddle, while William Hunter is a consistent performer for Alan King who is sure to hit the frame.
