ATR VERDICT: Loxley was deemed good enough to run in the Racing Post Trophy on just his second career start and will improve as a three-year-old, while Orange Suit hasn't been witnessed since winning on debut at Newbury in September and should enjoy this step up in distance being a half-brother to St Leger winner Simple Verse. Richard Hannon is well represented, though, and RAYMOND TUSK could prove best of the pair at this stage. The son of High Chaparral still holds an entry in the Eclipse, and created a lasting impression on his successful introduction at Newbury.
