**ATR VERDICT:** Paul Nicholls won this last season with If You Say Run, and the same owners are represented here by Listed bumper winner POSH TRISH, who remains a top-class prospect despite her season petering out in the spring. She has always been talked of as one to note when jumping obstacles and having accounted for Grade 2 winner Getaway Katie Mai in a bumper, it would be no surprise to see her as a leading performer in this sphere this season. Definitelyanoscar was only beaten half a length in a competitive Cheltenham bumper in the spring and only looks set to improve as she steps up in distance, with Empreinte Reconcé more than capable of building on her Newton Abbott victory in the summer and can't be discounted here. Jockey bookings suggest Festival Dawn is the pick of the Philip Hobbs-trained duo, while Meep Meep wasn't beaten far when fourth in Aintree's Grade 2 mares' bumper at the Grand National meeting and must be taken very seriously.
